755 ILCS 5/6-1

Amends the Probate Act of 1975. Makes a technical change to a Section concerning probate of wills.

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AN ACT concerning civil law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Probate Act of 1975 is amended by changing
Section 6-1 as follows:

6 (755 ILCS 5/6-1) (from Ch. 110 1/2, par. 6-1)

Sec. 6-1. Duty to file will - altering, destroying or secreting.)

9 (a) Immediately upon <u>the</u> the death of the testator any 10 person who has the testator's will in his possession shall file 11 it with the clerk of the court of the proper county and upon 12 failure or refusal to do so, the court on its motion or on the 13 petition of any interested person may issue an attachment and 14 compel the production of the will, subject to the provisions of 15 Section 5.15 of the Secretary of State Act.

16 If any person wilfully alters or destroys a will (b) 17 without the direction of the testator or wilfully secretes it for the period of 30 days after the death of the testator is 18 19 known to him, the person so offending, on conviction thereof, 20 shall be sentenced as in cases of theft of property classified 21 as a Class 3 felony by the law in effect at the date of the 22 offense. The 30-day period does not apply to the Secretary of State when acting pursuant to Section 5.15 of the Secretary of 23
