## SENATE RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, The economic competitiveness of the United States 3 and Illinois in the global economy requires a well-educated 4 workforce; and

5 WHEREAS, Students in Illinois currently average \$28,984 in 6 student debt upon graduation, which significantly hinders 7 their ability to participate in the local economy; and

8 WHEREAS, Current and future young people in the United 9 States and across Illinois should have the same opportunity 10 offered to those who went to college in previous generations, 11 including the ability to attend State colleges and universities 12 without taking on burdensome debt; and

WHEREAS, In 2015, higher education is more important than ever because it is an essential step to entering and remaining in the middle class; and

16 WHEREAS, Because of the importance of higher education, the 17 United States and state governments should expand the 18 opportunity to pursue and attain higher education to more 19 people than had that opportunity in the past; and

20 WHEREAS, Public investment in higher education pays off, as

5 WHEREAS, Student loan debt saddles the very students who 6 most depend on a college degree to level the economic playing field with a burden that constrains career choices and hurts 7 the credit rating of students, prevents people from fully 8 9 participating in the economy by purchasing goods and services, 10 and threatens essential milestones of the American dream, 11 including the purchase of a home or car, starting a family, and saving for retirement; and 12

13 WHEREAS, The Schatz-Schumer-Warren United States Senate 14 debt-free college resolution and the Grijalva-Ellison-Clark 15 United States House of Representatives debt-free college 16 resolution have gained national momentum in recent months and 17 has become central in the national dialogue around higher 18 education; and

19 WHEREAS, A national goal of debt-free college would include 20 significant federal aid to states, including Illinois; 21 therefore, be it

SR1525 -3-LRB099 18069 GRL 42856 r 1 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge Congress to 2 enact legislation that ensures that all students have access to debt-free higher education, defined to mean having no debt upon 3 graduation from any public institutions of higher education; 4 5 increases support to states so that those states can increase 6 investments in higher education and bring down costs for 7 students; increases aid to students to help them cover the total cost of college attendance without taking on debt; 8 encourages innovation by states and institutions of higher 9 10 education to increase efficiency, lower costs, and enable 11 speedy and less-costly degree completion; and reduces the 12 burden of existing student loan debt.
