- 5 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the

- 7 "Section 5. The Unified Code of Corrections is amended by
- 8 adding Section 3-12-16 as follows:
- 9 (730 ILCS 5/3-12-16 new)
- 10 <u>Sec. 3-12-16. Helping Paws Service Dog Program.</u>
- 11 (a) In this Section:
- 12 <u>"Disabled person" means a person who suffers from a</u>
- 13 physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one
- or more major life activities.
- 15 <u>"Program" means the Helping Paws Service Dog Program</u>
- created by this Section.
- 17 <u>"Service dog" means a dog trained in obedience and task</u>
- skills to meet the needs of a disabled person.
- 19 <u>"Animal care professional" means a person certified to</u>
- 20 work in animal care related services, such as grooming,
- 21 <u>kenneling</u>, and any other related fields.

- 1 <u>"Service dog professional" means a person certified to</u>
- 2 train service dogs by an agency, organization, or school
- 3 <u>approved by the Department.</u>
- 4 (b) The Department shall establish the Helping Paws
- 5 <u>Service Dog Program to train committed persons to be service</u>
- 6 dog trainers and animal care professionals. The Department
- 7 <u>shall select committed persons in various correctional</u>
- 8 <u>institutions and facilities to participate in the Program.</u>
- 9 (c) Priority for participation in the Program must be
- 10 given to committed persons who either have a high school
- 11 <u>diploma</u> or have passed the high school level Test of General
- 12 <u>Educational Development (GED).</u>
- 13 (d) The Department shall contract with service dog
- 14 professionals to train committed persons to be certified
- 15 <u>service dog trainers. Service dog professionals shall train</u>
- 16 committed persons in dog obedience training, service dog
- 17 <u>training</u>, and animal health care. Upon successful completion
- 18 of the training, a committed person shall receive
- 19 <u>certification</u> by an agency, organization, or school approved
- 20 <u>by the Department.</u>
- 21 <u>(e) The Department shall designate a non-profit</u>
- 22 <u>organization to select animals from humane societies and</u>
- 23 <u>shelters for the purpose of being trained as service dogs and</u>
- 24 <u>for participation in any program designed to train animal</u>
- 25 care professionals.
- 26 (f) After a dog is trained by the committed person as a
- 27 <u>service dog, a review committee consisting of an equal number</u>
- 28 <u>of persons from the Department and the non-profit</u>
- 29 <u>organization shall select a disabled person to receive the</u>
- 30 <u>service dog free of charge.</u>
- 31 (g) Employees of the Department shall periodically visit
- 32 <u>disabled persons who have received service dogs from the</u>
- 33 <u>Department under this Section to determine whether the needs</u>
- of the disabled persons have been met by the service dogs

- 1 <u>trained by committed persons.</u>
- 2 (h) Employees of the Department shall periodically visit
- 3 <u>committed persons who have been certified as service dog</u>
- 4 <u>trainers or animal care professionals and who have been</u>
- 5 paroled or placed on mandatory supervised release to
- 6 <u>determine whether the committed persons are using their</u>
- 7 <u>skills as certified service dog trainers or animal care</u>
- 8 <u>professionals.</u>
- 9 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 10 becoming law.".
