- 4 Section 5. The Energy Assistance Act of 1989 is amended

shall, 1 subsection (a) of this Section subject to 2 appropriation from the General Assembly and subject to availability of funds to the Department, receive energy 3 4 assistance as provided by this Act. The Department, upon 5 receipt of monies authorized pursuant to this Act for energy 6 assistance, shall commit funds for each qualified applicant 7 in an amount determined by the Department. In determining 8 the amounts of assistance to be provided to or on behalf of a 9 qualified applicant, the Department shall ensure that the highest amounts of assistance go to households with the 10 11 greatest energy costs in relation to household income. The Department shall include factors such as energy costs, 12 household size, household income, and region of 13 the State when determining individual household benefits. 14 In setting assistance levels, the Department shall attempt to provide 15 16 assistance to approximately the same number of households who the 1991 Residential Energy Assistance 17 participated in 18 Partnership Program. Such assistance levels shall be 19 adjusted annually on the basis of funding availability. promulgating rules for the administration of this Section the 20 Department shall assure that a minimum of 1/3 of funds 21 22 available for benefits to eligible households are made 23 available to households who are eligible for public assistance and that elderly and disabled households are 24 25 offered a one-month application period. 26

(c) If the applicant is not a customer of an energy provider for winter energy services or an applicant for such service, such applicant shall receive a direct energy assistance payment in an amount established by the Department for all such applicants under this Act; provided, however, that such an applicant must have rental expenses for housing greater than 30% of household income.
