- 1 AN ACT relating to political solicitations and
- 2 contributions, amending certain Acts.
- 3 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 4 represented in the General Assembly:
- 5 Section 5. The Election Code is amended by adding
- 6 Section 9-25.2 as follows:
- 7 (10 ILCS 5/9-25.2 new)
- 8 <u>Sec. 9-25.2. Contributions; candidate or treasurer of</u>
- 9 political committee.
- 10 (a) No candidate may knowingly receive any contribution
- 11 <u>solicited or received in violation of Section 33-3.1 of the</u>
- 12 <u>Criminal Code of 1961.</u>
- 13 (b) The receipt of political contributions in violation
- of this Section shall constitute a Class A misdemeanor.
- The appropriate State's Attorney or the Attorney General
- shall bring actions in the name of the people of the State of
- 17 <u>Illinois.</u>
- 18 (c) Any contribution solicited in violation of Section
- 19 <u>33-3.1 of the Criminal Code of 1961 shall escheat to the</u>
- 20 State of Illinois. Any candidate or political committee that
- 21 <u>receives a contribution prohibited by this Section shall</u>
- forward it immediately to the State Treasurer.
- 23 Section 10. The Criminal Code of 1961 is amended by
- 24 adding Section 33-3.1 as follows:
- 25 (720 ILCS 5/33-3.1 new)
- Sec. 33-3.1. Solicitation misconduct.
- 27 <u>(a) A public employee commits solicitation misconduct</u>
- 28 when he or she solicits or receives contributions, as that
- 29 term is defined in Section 9-1.4 of the Election Code, from a

- 1 person engaged in a business or activity over which the
- 2 <u>public employee has the responsibility to investigate or</u>
- 3 inspect, and enforce, regulatory measures necessary to the
- 4 requirements of any State or federal statute or regulation
- 5 <u>relating to the business or activity.</u>
- 6 (b) A public employee convicted of committing
- 7 <u>solicitation misconduct forfeits his or her employment. In</u>
- 8 <u>addition, he or she commits a Class A misdemeanor.</u>
- 9 (c) All State agencies, as that term is defined in the
- 10 <u>Illinois State Auditing Act, shall designate by filing a list</u>
- 11 <u>with the Secretary of State indicating the names and titles</u>
- of the public employees whose duties include investigating or
- inspecting, and enforcing, regulatory measures necessary to
- 14 the requirements of any State or federal statute or
- 15 regulation. A public employee, including those not
- 16 <u>designated under this Section, may be found in violation of</u>
- 17 <u>this Section upon a showing that he or she acted in concert</u>
- 18 <u>with a public employee whose duty includes investigating or</u>
- 19 <u>inspecting</u>, and enforcing, regulatory measures necessary to
- 20 <u>the requirements of a State or federal statute or regulation</u>
- 21 <u>to solicit or receive contributions in violation of this</u>
- 22 <u>Section</u>. <u>Designation under this Section does not constitute</u>
- 23 <u>a presumption that an employee not so designated is outside</u>
- 24 <u>the scope of this Section.</u>
- 25 (d) An employee of a State agency who is discharged,
- demoted, suspended, threatened, harassed, or in any other
- 27 <u>manner discriminated against in the terms and conditions of</u>
- 28 <u>employment by a State agency because of lawful acts done by</u>
- 29 the employee or on behalf of the employee or others in
- 30 <u>furtherance of the enforcement of this Section shall be</u>
- 31 <u>entitled to all relief necessary to make the employee whole.</u>
- 32 <u>The employee's relief shall include reinstatement with the</u>
- 33 <u>seniority status the employee would have had but for the</u>
- 34 <u>discrimination</u>, 2 times the amount of the employee's back

- 1 pay, interest on the back pay, and compensation for any
- 2 special damages sustained as a result of the discrimination,
- 3 <u>including litigation costs and reasonable attorney's fees.</u>
- 4 An employee may bring an action for relief under this
- 5 <u>subsection (d) in the appropriate circuit court.</u>
- 6 (e) The Department of State Police shall establish a
- 7 toll-free number to allow employees of State agencies and
- 8 <u>other individuals and businesses to register complaints</u>
- 9 regarding possible violations of this Section. All
- 10 <u>information provided to the State Police regarding possible</u>
- 11 <u>violations of this Section shall remain confidential.</u>
- 12 <u>(f) Any person who knowingly makes a false report of</u>
- 13 <u>solicitation misconduct to the State Police, the Attorney</u>
- 14 General, a State's Attorney, or any law enforcement official
- shall be guilty of a Class C misdemeanor.
- 16 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 17 becoming law.
