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AN ACT concerning Gulf War Veterans.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Department of Veterans Affairs Act is 5 amended by changing Section 2 as follows:

6 (20 ILCS 2805/2) (from Ch. 126 1/2, par. 67)

7 Sec. 2. Powers and duties. The Department shall have8 the following powers and duties:

To perform such acts at the request of any veteran, or 9 his or her spouse, surviving spouse or dependents as shall be 10 reasonably necessary or reasonably incident to obtaining or 11 endeavoring to obtain for the requester any advantage, 12 13 benefit or emolument accruing or due to such person under any law of the United States, the State of Illinois or any other 14 15 state or governmental agency by reason of the service of such veteran, and in pursuance thereof shall: 16

Contact veterans, their survivors and dependents
 and advise them of the benefits of state and federal laws
 and assist them in obtaining such benefits;

20 2. Establish field offices and direct the
21 activities of the personnel assigned to such offices;

Create a volunteer field force of accredited
 representatives, representing educational institutions,
 labor organizations, veterans organizations, employers,
 churches, and farm organizations;

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4. Conduct informational and training services;

27 5. Conduct educational programs through newspapers,
28 periodicals and radio for the specific purpose of
29 disseminating information affecting veterans and their
30 dependents;

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6. Coordinate the services and activities of all

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state departments having services and resources affecting
 veterans and their dependents;

3 7. Encourage and assist in the coordination of
4 agencies within counties giving service to veterans and
5 their dependents;

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8. Cooperate with veterans organizations and other governmental agencies;

8 9. Make, alter, amend and promulgate reasonable
9 rules and procedures for the administration of this Act;
10 and

11 10. Make and publish annual reports to the Governor
 12 regarding the administration and general operation of the
 13 Department.

Encourage the State to implement more programs 14 11. to address the wide range of issues faced by Persian Gulf 15 16 War Veterans, especially those who took part in combat, by creating an official commission to further study 17 Persian Gulf War Diseases. The commission shall consist 18 of 9 members appointed as follows: the Speaker and 19 Minority Leader of the House of Representatives and the 20 21 President and Minority Leader of the Senate shall each 22 appoint one member from the General Assembly, the 23 Governor shall appoint 4 members to represent veterans' organizations, and the Department shall appoint one 24 25 The commission members shall serve without member. compensation. 26

27 <u>12. Make grants, from moneys appropriated from the</u>
 28 <u>Gulf War Memorial Fund, to private organizations for the</u>
 29 <u>costs of erecting a Gulf War Memorial in Illinois.</u>

30 The Department may accept and hold on behalf of the 31 State, if for the public interest, a grant, gift, devise or 32 bequest of money or property to the Department made for the 33 general benefit of Illinois veterans, including the conduct 34 of informational and training services by the Department and

1 other authorized purposes of the Department. The Department 2 shall cause each grant, gift, devise or bequest to be kept as a distinct fund and shall invest such funds in the manner 3 4 provided by the Public Funds Investment Act, as now or hereafter amended, and shall make such reports as may be 5 required by the Comptroller concerning what funds are so held 6 7 and the manner in which such funds are invested. The Department may make grants from these funds for the general 8 9 benefit of Illinois veterans. Grants from these funds, except for the funds established under Sections 2.01a and 10 11 2.03, shall be subject to appropriation.

2.2 Sec. 507W. Gulf War Memorial Fund. The Department shall 23 print on its standard individual income tax form a provision indicating that if the taxpayer wishes to contribute to the 24 25 Gulf War Memorial Fund, as authorized by this amendatory Act of the 92nd General Assembly, he or she may do so by stating 26 27 the amount of the contribution (not less than \$1) on the return and that the contribution will reduce the taxpayer's 28 refund or increase the amount of payment to accompany the 29 return. Failure to remit any amount of increased payment 30

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not apply to any amended return.

Sec. 509. Tax checkoff explanations. All individual 4 5 income tax return forms shall contain appropriate б explanations and spaces to enable the taxpayers to designate contributions to the Child Abuse Prevention Fund, to the 7 8 Community Health Center Care Fund, to the Illinois Wildlife Preservation Fund as required by the Illinois Non-Game 9 10 Wildlife Protection Act, to the Alzheimer's Disease Research 11 Fund as required by the Alzheimer's Disease Research Act, to the Assistance to the Homeless Fund as required by this Act, 12 to the Heritage Preservation Fund as required by the Heritage 13 14 Preservation Act, to the Child Care Expansion Program Fund as 15 required by the Child Care Expansion Program Act, to the Ryan White AIDS Victims Assistance Fund, to 16 the Assistive 17 Technology for Persons with Disabilities Fund, to the 18 Domestic Violence Shelter and Service Fund, to the United States Olympians Assistance Fund, to the Youth Drug Abuse 19 20 Prevention Fund, to the Persian Gulf Conflict Veterans Fund, 21 to the Literacy Advancement Fund, to the Ryan White Pediatric 22 and Adult AIDS Fund, to the Illinois Special Olympics Checkoff Fund, to the Penny Severns Breast and Cervical 23 24 Cancer Research Fund, to the Korean War Memorial Fund, to the Heart Disease Treatment and Prevention Fund, 25 to the Hemophilia Treatment Fund, to the Mental Health Research 26 Fund, to the Children's Cancer Fund, to the American Diabetes 27 28 Association Fund, to the National World War II Memorial Fund, 29 to the Prostate Cancer Research Fund, to the Gulf War Memorial Fund, and to the Meals on Wheels Fund. 2 If, on October 1 of any year, the total contributions to any one of the funds made under this Section do not equal 3 4 \$100,000 or more, the explanations and spaces for designating 5 contributions to the fund shall be removed from the 6 individual income tax return forms for the following and all 7 subsequent years and all subsequent contributions to the fund 8 shall be refunded to the taxpayer.

Determination of amounts contributed. 13 The Department shall determine the total amount contributed to 14 15 each of the following: the Child Abuse Prevention Fund, the Illinois Wildlife Preservation Fund, the Community Health 16 17 Center Care Fund, the Assistance to the Homeless Fund, the 18 Alzheimer's Disease Research Fund, the Heritage Preservation Fund, the Child Care Expansion Program Fund, the Ryan White 19 AIDS Victims Assistance Fund, the Assistive Technology for 20 21 Persons with Disabilities Fund, the Domestic Violence Shelter 22 and Service Fund, the United States Olympians Assistance Fund, the Youth Drug Abuse Prevention Fund, the Persian Gulf 23 24 Conflict Veterans Fund, the Literacy Advancement Fund, the Ryan White Pediatric and Adult AIDS Fund, the Illinois 25 Special Olympics Checkoff Fund, the Penny Severns Breast 26 and Cervical Cancer Research Fund, the Korean War Memorial Fund, 27 the Heart Disease Treatment and Prevention 28 Fund, the 29 Hemophilia Treatment Fund, the Mental Health Research Fund, 30 the Children's Cancer Fund, the American Diabetes 31 Association Fund, the National World War II Memorial Fund, the Prostate Cancer Research Fund, the Gulf War Memorial 32 33 Fund, and the Meals on Wheels Fund; and shall notify the

8 Section 20. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by 9 changing Section 3-412 and adding Section 3-648 as follows:

10 (625 ILCS 5/3-412) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 3-412)

Sec. 3-412. Registration plates and registration
 stickers to be furnished by the Secretary of State.

The Secretary of State upon registering a vehicle 13 (a) 14 subject to annual registration for the first time shall or shall cause to be issued to the owner one 15 issue registration plate for a motorcycle, trailer, semitrailer, 16 17 motorized pedalcycle or truck-tractor, 2 registration plates for other motor vehicles and, where applicable, current 18 stickers for motor vehicles of the first 19 registration 20 division. The provisions of this Section may be made 21 applicable to such vehicles of the second division, as the Secretary of State may, from time to time, in his discretion 22 23 designate. On subsequent annual registrations during the term of the registration plate as provided in Section 3-414.1, the 24 Secretary shall issue or cause to be issued registration 25 stickers as evidence of current registration. However, the 26 27 issuance of annual registration stickers to vehicles 28 registered under the provisions of Section 3-402.1 of this Code may not be required if the Secretary deems the issuance 29 30 unnecessary.

31 (b) Every registration plate shall have displayed upon 32 it the registration number assigned to the vehicle for which

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1 it. is issued, the name of this State, which may be 2 abbreviated, the year number for which it was issued, which may be abbreviated, the phrase "Land of Lincoln", except as 3 4 provided in Sections 3-626, 3-629, 3-633, 3-634, 3-637, 5 3-638, and 3-642, and 3-648, and such other letters or 6 numbers the Secretary may prescribe. However, for as 7 apportionment plates issued to vehicles registered under Section 3-402.1, the phrase "Land of Lincoln" may be omitted 8 9 to allow for the word "apportioned" to be displayed. The Secretary may in his discretion prescribe that letters be 10 11 used as prefixes only on registration plates issued to vehicles of the first division which are registered under 12 this Code and only as suffixes on registration plates issued 13 to other vehicles. Every registration sticker issued as 14 15 evidence of current registration shall designate the year 16 number for which it is issued and such other letters or numbers as the Secretary may prescribe and shall be of a 17 18 contrasting color with the registration plates and registration stickers of the previous year. 19

20 (c) Each registration plate and the required letters and 21 numerals thereon, except the year number for which issued, 22 shall be of sufficient size to be plainly readable from a 23 distance of 100 feet during daylight, and shall be coated 24 with reflectorizing material. The dimensions of the plate 25 issued to vehicles of the first division shall be 6 by 12 26 inches.

(d) The Secretary of State shall issue for every
passenger motor vehicle rented without a driver the same type
of registration plates as the type of plates issued for a
private passenger vehicle.

31 (e) The Secretary of State shall issue for every 32 passenger car used as a taxicab or livery, distinctive 33 registration plates.

34 (f) The Secretary of State shall issue for every

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1 motorcycle distinctive registration plates distinguishing 2 between motorcycles having 150 or more cubic centimeters 3 piston displacement, or having less than 150 cubic centimeter 4 piston displacement.

5 (g) Registration plates issued to vehicles for-hire may 6 display a designation as determined by the Secretary that 7 such vehicles are for-hire.

8 (h) The Secretary of State shall issue for each electric 9 vehicle distinctive registration plates which shall 10 distinguish between electric vehicles having a maximum 11 operating speed of 45 miles per hour or more and those having 12 a maximum operating speed of less than 45 miles per hour.

(i) The Secretary of State shall issue for every public
and private ambulance registration plates identifying the
vehicle as an ambulance. The Secretary shall forward to the
Department of Public Aid registration information for the
purpose of verification of claims filed with the Department
by ambulance owners for payment for services to public
assistance recipients.

(j) The Secretary of State shall issue for every public 20 21 and private medical carrier or rescue vehicle livery 22 registration plates displaying numbers within ranges of 23 numbers reserved respectively for medical carriers and rescue vehicles. The Secretary shall forward to the Department of 24 25 Public Aid registration information for the purpose of verification of claims filed with the Department by owners of 26 medical carriers or rescue vehicles for payment for services 27 to public assistance recipients. 28

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1 Sec. 3-648. Gulf War Veteran license plate. 2 (a) In addition to any other special license plate, the Secretary of State, upon receipt of all applicable fees and 3 4 applications made in the form prescribed by the Secretary, may issue special registration plates designated as Gulf War 5 Veteran license plates to residents of Illinois who 6 participated in the Persian Gulf Conflict between the dates 7 8 recognized by the United States Department of Veterans 9 Affairs. The special plate issued under this Section must be 10 affixed only to passenger vehicles of the first division, motor vehicles of the second division, and recreational 11 vehicles as defined in Section 1-169 of this Code. Plates 12 issued under this Section shall expire according to the 13 staggered multi-year procedure established by Section 3-414.1 14 15 of this Code.

16 (b) The design, color, and format of the plates shall be wholly within the discretion of the Secretary of State. The 17 Secretary may, in his or her discretion, allow the plates to 18 be issued as vanity plates or personalized in accordance with 19 Section 3-405.1 of this Code. The plates are not required to 20 designate "Land of Lincoln", as prescribed in subsection (b) 21 of Section 3-412 of this Code. The Secretary shall prescribe 22 the eligibility requirements and, in his or her discretion, 23 shall approve and prescribe stickers or decals as provided 24 25 under Section 3-412.

(c) An applicant must be charged a \$15 fee for original 26 27 issuance in addition to the applicable registration fee. Of the additional fee, \$13 must be deposited into the Secretary 28 29 of State Special License Plate Fund and \$2 must be deposited into the Gulf War Memorial Fund. For each registration 30 renewal period, a \$2 fee, in addition to the appropriate 31 registration fee, must be charged and must be deposited into 32 the Secretary of State Special Licenses Plate Fund. 33

34 (d) The Gulf War Memorial Fund is created as a special

1 fund in the State treasury. Moneys in the Fund may, subject to appropriation, be used by the Department of Veterans' 2 3 Affairs to provide grants for the construction of the Gulf 4 War Memorial. Upon the completion of the Memorial, the 5 Department of Veterans' Affairs must certify to the State Treasurer that the construction of the Memorial has been б completed. Upon the certification of the Department of 7 Veterans' Affairs, the State Treasurer must transfer all 8 moneys in the Fund into the Secretary of State Special 9 10 <u>License Plate Fund.</u>
