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AN ACT regarding vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by
changing Section 3-821 as follows:

б (625 ILCS 5/3-821) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 3-821) Sec. 3-821. Miscellaneous Registration and Title Fees. 7 8 (a) The fee to be paid to the Secretary of State for the following certificates, registrations or evidences of proper 9 registration, or for corrected or duplicate documents shall 10 be in accordance with the following schedule: 11 Certificate of Title, except for an all-terrain 12 13 vehicle or off-highway motorcycle <u>\$13</u> \$65 Certificate of Title for an all-terrain vehicle 14 15 or off-highway motorcycle \$30 16 Certificate of Title for an all-terrain vehicle off-highway motorcycle used for production 17 or 18 agriculture, or accepted by a dealer in trade 13 Transfer of Registration or any evidence of 19 20 proper registration 15 Duplicate Registration Card for plates or other 21 22 evidence of proper registration 3 Duplicate Registration Sticker or Stickers, each 5 23 Duplicate Certificate of Title 65 24 Corrected Registration Card or Card for other 25 evidence of proper registration 26 3 27 Corrected Certificate of Title 65 Salvage Certificate 4 28 Fleet Reciprocity Permit 29 15 Prorate Decal 30 1 Prorate Backing Plate 3 31

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There shall be no fee paid for a Junking Certificate.

2 (b) The Secretary may prescribe the maximum service 3 charge to be imposed upon an applicant for renewal of a 4 registration by any person authorized by law to receive and 5 remit or transmit to the Secretary such renewal application 6 and fees therewith.

(c) If a check is delivered to the Office of 7 the 8 Secretary of State as payment of any fee or tax under this Code, and such check is not honored by the bank on which it 9 is drawn for any reason, the registrant or other person 10 11 tendering the check remains liable for the payment of such fee or tax. The Secretary of State may assess a service 12 charge of \$19 in addition to the fee or tax due and owing for 13 all dishonored checks. 14

15 If the total amount then due and owing exceeds the sum 16 of \$50 and has not been paid in full within 60 days from the 17 date such fee or tax became due to the Secretary of State, 18 the Secretary of State shall assess a penalty of 25% of such 19 amount remaining unpaid.

20 All amounts payable under this Section shall be computed 21 to the nearest dollar.

22 (d) The minimum fee and tax to be paid by any applicant 23 for apportionment of a fleet of vehicles under this Code shall be \$15 if the application was filed on or before the 24 25 date specified by the Secretary together with fees and taxes due. If an application and the fees or taxes due are filed 26 after the date specified by the Secretary, the Secretary may 27 prescribe the payment of interest at the rate of 1/2 of 28 18 29 per month or fraction thereof after such due date and a 30 minimum of \$8.

31 (e) Trucks, truck tractors, truck tractors with loads,
32 and motor buses, any one of which having a combined total
33 weight in excess of 12,000 lbs. shall file an application for
34 a Fleet Reciprocity Permit issued by the Secretary of State.

1 This permit shall be in the possession of any driver 2 operating a vehicle on Illinois highways. Any foreign licensed vehicle of the second division operating at any time 3 4 Illinois without a Fleet Reciprocity Permit or other in proper Illinois registration, shall subject the operator to 5 6 the penalties provided in Section 3-834 of this Code. For the purposes of this Code, "Fleet Reciprocity Permit" means 7 any second division motor vehicle with a foreign license and 8 9 used only in interstate transportation of goods. The fee for such permit shall be \$15 per fleet which shall include all 10 11 vehicles of the fleet being registered.

(f) For purposes of this Section, "all-terrain vehicle 12 or off-highway motorcycle used for production agriculture" 13 means any all-terrain vehicle or off-highway motorcycle used 14 in the raising of or the propagation of livestock, crops for 15 16 sale for human consumption, crops for livestock consumption, and production seed stock grown for the propagation of feed 17 grains and the husbandry of animals or for the purpose of 18 19 providing a food product, including the husbandry of blood stock as a main source of providing a food product. 20 21 "All-terrain vehicle or off-highway motorcycle used in production agriculture" also means any all-terrain vehicle or 22 23 off-highway motorcycle used in animal husbandry, floriculture, aquaculture, horticulture, and viticulture. 24 (Source: P.A. 90-287, eff. 1-1-98; 90-774, eff. 8-14-98; 25 91-37, eff. 7-1-99; 91-441, eff. 1-1-00; revised 10-19-99.) 26

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
