- 4 Section 5. The Illinois Controlled Substances Act is
- 5 amended by adding Section 322 as follows:

- Sec. 322. Grants for ecstasy abuse prevention.
- 8 <u>(a) The Secretary of Human Services may make grants to,</u>
- 9 and enter into contracts and cooperative agreements with,
- 10 <u>public</u> and <u>nonprofit</u> <u>private</u> <u>entities</u> to <u>enable</u> those

- 12 (1) to carry out school-based programs concerning
