AN ACT concerning education.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:
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## Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Section 21-28 as follows:

(105 ILCS 5/21-28 new)
Sec. 21-28. Paraeducator certificate.
(a) The State Board of Education shall jointly establish, with the State Teacher Certification Board, and administer a certification program for paraeducators. A school district, other than a school district organized under Article 34 of this Code, may not hire a person on or after July 1, 2002 to work alongside and under the supervision of a certified teacher or other licensed professional staff member to support and assist in providing instructional and other services to children and their families unless that person is certified as a paraeducator by the state Teacher Certification Board. This prohibition does not apply to a person who, before July 1, 2002 and at the time of application for the job, was employed by the school district in a similar position.
(b) Paraeducator certificates shall be classified as follows:
(1) The State Board of Education may issue a

Paraeducator I Certificate to a person who has completed
30 credits of approved study in the form of semester
hours, continuing education units, continuing
professional development units, or any combination of
these. A certified teacher or other licensed
professional staff member must directly supervise the
instructional and non-instructional duties of a person
holding a Paraeducator I Certificate. This certificate holder may assist the certified teacher or other licensed professional staff member in any of the following ways:
(A) By reviewing and reinforcing previously introduced learning.
(B) By assisting in preparation of instructional and non-instructional materials.
(C) By assisting in student supervision.
(D) By providing classroom management functions.
(2) The State Board of Education may issue a Paraeducator II Certificate to a person who has completed 60 credits of approved study in the form of semester hours, continuing education units, continuing professional development units, or any combination of these. A certified teacher or other licensed professional staff member must directly supervise a person holding a Paraeducator II Certificate. This certificate holder may assist the certified teacher or other licensed professional staff member in any of the following ways, in addition to those listed in subdivision (1) of this subsection (b):
(A) By introducing new learning, which must be preplanned in collaboration with the certified teacher or other licensed professional staff member.
(B) By assisting with student instruction.
(C) By assisting with monitoring student assessment.
(D) By performing short-term instruction and classroom management activities.
(3) The State Board of Education may issue a Paraeducator III Certificate to a person who has completed 90 credits of approved study in the form of semester hours, continuing education units, continuing
professional development units, or any combination of these. A certified teacher or other licensed professional staff member must directly supervise a person holding a Paraeducator III Certificate. This certificate holder may assist the certified teacher or other licensed professional staff member in any of the following ways, in addition to those listed in subdivisions (1) and (2) of this subsection (b):
(A) By meeting with the certified teacher or other licensed professional staff member to receive instruction or direction on a regular basis.
(B) By assisting the certified teacher or other licensed professional staff member in maintaining the physical integrity of the learning environment.
(C) By assisting with parental contact.
(D) By supervising and documenting student instruction, behavior, and achievement.
(4) The State Board of Education may issue a Paraeducator IV Certificate to a person who has a bachelor's degree. The holder of a Paraeducator IV Certificate may assist a certified teacher or other licensed professional staff member in any of the ways listed in subdivisions (1), (2), and (3) of this subsection (b). This certificate holder must have all of the following abilities:
(A) The ability to motivate and assist with non-supervised student instruction.
(B) The ability to plan, prepare, and modify lesson plans, demonstrating an awareness of diversity among the children, families, and colleagues with whom the person works.
(C) The ability to provide non-supervised individual and group instruction.

& \text { (c) A paraeducation certificate is valid for } 5 \text { years. A }
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$$ person must apply to the state Board of Education through the regional superintendent of schools to receive or renew a paraeducator certificate or to have the certificate reclassified. An initial certificate may not be issued or renewed until the applicant pays a $\$ 25$ fee to the state Board of Education. A certificate holder must maintain an accumulative portfolio of his or her work in a form determined jointly by the State Teacher Certification Board and the State Board of Education.

(d) The State Board of Education shall establish a paraeducator advisory committee consisting of 11 members, 6 of whom must be paraeducators. The paraeducator members shall be selected by the Illinois Education Association and the Illinois Federation of Teachers in proportion to each group's paraeducator membership in all school districts, excluding a school district organized under Article 34 of this Code. The committee shall recommend to the state Board of Education (i) guidelines and rules necessary to implement the paraeducator certification program, (ii) guidelines for paraeducator education, and (iii) experience requirements for career advancement.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1, 2001 .
