- 1 AN ACT in relation to public employee benefits.
- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Illinois Pension Code is amended by
- 5 changing Sections 17-121, 17-122, 17-124, and 17-125 and
- 6 adding Section 17-126.1 as follows:
- 7 (40 ILCS 5/17-121) (from Ch. 108 1/2, par. 17-121)
- 8 Sec. 17-121. Survivor's and Children's pensions
- 9 Eligibility. Beginning January 1, 2003, remarriage at any age
- 10 by a surviving spouse shall not terminate his or her
- 11 <u>survivor's pension. A surviving spouse whose pension was</u>
- 12 <u>terminated before January 1, 2003 due to remarriage at any</u>
- 13 age and who applies for reinstatement of that pension and
- 14 repays the amount of any survivor refund with interest in
- 15 <u>accordance</u> with <u>Section 17-126.1 shall be entitled to have</u>
- 16 <u>the pension reinstated upon application for reinstatement and</u>
- 17 repayment of the survivor refund. A--surviving--spouse--of--a
- 18 teacher--shall-be-entitled-to-a-survivor-s-pension-only-if-he
- 19 was-married-to-the-contributor--for--at--least--1--1/2--years
- 20 immediately-prior-to-his-death-or-retirement,-whichever-first
- 21 occurs,--and--also-on-the-date-of-the-last-termination-of-his
- 22 service.
- 23 If-the-surviving-spouse-is-under-age-5θ-and-there-are--no
- 24 eligible-minor-children-born-to-or-legally-adopted-by-the

- 28 Remarriage-of-the-surviving-spouse-prior-to-September--1,

- 31 subsequent-change-in-marital-status;--however,--beginning

- 1 September--1,--1983,--remarriage--of-a-surviving-spouse-after

- 9 A surviving spouse of a member or annuitant under this

- contributions is repaid to the Fund and application is made 13
- within 30 days after the effective date of this amendatory 14

- 18 Sec. 17-122. Survivor's and children's pensions - Amount.
- Upon the death of a teacher who has completed at least 1 1/2 19
- 20 years of contributing service with either this Fund or the
- 21 State Universities Retirement System or the Teachers'
- 22 Retirement System of the State of Illinois, provided his
- death occurred while (a) in active service covered by 23
- 24 Fund or during his first 18 months of continuous employment
- without a break in service under any other participating
- defined in the Illinois Retirement Systems

Reciprocal Act except the State Universities Retirement

- 28 System and the Teachers' Retirement System of the State of
- 29 Illinois, (b) on a creditable leave of absence, (c) on a
- noncreditable leave of absence of no more than one year, or 30
- 31 (d) a pension was deferred or pending provided the teacher
- had at least 10 years of validated service credit, or upon 32
- 33 the death of a pensioner otherwise qualified for such

- 1 benefit, the surviving spouse and eliqible and-unmarried

- 17 member is otherwise ineligible for a survivor's pension, a
- 18 children's pension for eligible minor children under--age--18
- 19 shall be paid to their parent or legal guardian for their
- 20 benefit according to the following percentages:
- 21 30% of average salary for one child;
- 22 60% of average salary for 2 or more children.
- 23 <u>A disabled child who was dependent upon a deceased</u>
- 24 <u>teacher at the time of his or her death whose children's</u>
- 25 pension was terminated due to attainment of age 18 may apply
- 26 <u>to the Fund for reinstatement of that pension. An</u>
- 27 <u>application for reinstatement shall be accompanied by the</u>
- 28 payment of an amount equal to (1) the amount of any refund
- received by the deceased teacher under Section 17-125 and (2)
- 30 <u>interest thereon from the date of the payment of the refund</u>
- 31 to the date of application for reinstatement at the rate of
- 32 <u>6% per year. The reinstated pension shall begin to accrue on</u>

- 9 The changes made to this Section and Section 17-121 by

- 12 <u>notwithstanding Section 17-157 and without regard to whether</u>
- 13 the deceased teacher was in service on or after the effective
- 14 <u>date of this amendatory Act.</u>

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- On January 1, 1981, any survivor or child who was
- 16 receiving a survivor's or children's pension on or before
- January 1, 1971, shall have his survivor's or children's
- 18 pension then being paid increased by 1% for each full year
- 19 which has elapsed from the date the pension began. On January
- 20 1, 1982, any survivor or child whose pension began after
- January 1, 1971, but before January 1, 1981, shall have his
- 22 survivor's or children's pension then being paid increased 1%
- 23 for each full year which has elapsed from the date the

pension began. On January 1, 1987, any survivor or child

whose pension began on or before January 1, 1977, shall have

- the monthly survivor's or children's pension increased by \$1
- for each full year which has elapsed since the pension began.
- Beginning January 1, 1990, every survivor's and
- 29 children's pension shall be increased (1) on each January 1
- 30 occurring on or after the commencement of the pension if the
- 31 deceased teacher died while receiving a retirement pension,
- or (2) in other cases, on each January 1 occurring on or
- 33 after the first anniversary of the commencement of the

- 15 The minimum total survivor's and children's pension payable
- 16 upon the death of a contributor or annuitant which occurs
- 17 after December 31, 1986, shall be 50% of the earned

- 19 calculated without early retirement discount in the case of
- 20 death in service.
- On death after retirement, the total survivor's and
- 22 children's pensions shall not exceed the monthly retirement
- 23 or disability pension paid to the deceased retirant.
- 24 Survivor's and children's benefits described in this Section
- 25 shall apply to all service and disability pensioners eligible
- for a pension as of July 1, 1981.
- 27 <u>For the purposes of this Section, the term "eliqible</u>
- 28 <u>child" means an unmarried minor child of a deceased teacher</u>
- 29 who is under 18 years of age or a child of a deceased teacher
- 30 who is disabled and was dependent upon the deceased teacher
- 31 <u>at the time of his or her death regardless of age.</u>

Death Benefits - Death on pension. written application to the Board, there shall be paid to the estate of a deceased teacher-pensioner pension payments, temporarily withheld or represented by checks accrued, uncashed at the date of his death and the excess, if any, of an amount equal to his refundable contributions for service or disability retirement pension over pension to the date of death; provided, that if there be filed with the Board prior to the death of the pensioner his written direction, acknowledged before an officer authorized to take acknowledgments, that such payments be paid to designated beneficiaries, they shall be so paid on written application therefor to the Board. If none of several named beneficiaries survives the pensioner and no directive was furnished by the member to cover this contingency, the deceased beneficiary's share shall be paid to the estate of the pensioner.

If a reversionary pension is payable upon death of a pensioner, the determination and payment of any refund of contributions payable under this Section shall be made upon death of the reversionary pensioner. At such time a refund of contributions less (1) the amount contributed for annual increases in pension and (2) total pension payments to the teacher-pensioner and survivor shall be paid in the manner provided in this Section to the designated beneficiaries, or estate of the deceased survivor.

If a pension is payable to a surviving spouse or eligible child and/or--minor--children upon death of a pensioner, the determination of any refund of contributions payable under this Section shall be made when the last of those pensions is no longer payable upon-death-of-the-survivor-and-marriage-or attainment-of-age-18-of-minor-children. At that time a refund of contributions for retirement and survivors' and children's pensions less total pension payments to the teacher-pensioner, surviving spouse, and eligible survivors

- 1 and--minor children shall be paid in the manner provided in
- 2 this Section to the designated beneficiaries, or estate of
- 3 the deceased survivor.
- 4 If eliqible beneficiaries for survivors' or children's
- 5 benefits existed at the time of a pensioner's retirement but
- 6 not on the date of his death thereafter, the excess of total
- 7 contributions for retirement and survivors' and children's
- 8 pensions over pensions paid shall be determined upon death of
- 9 the pensioner and paid in the manner provided in this Section
- 10 to the designated beneficiaries, or estate of the deceased
- 11 teacher-pensioner.
- 12 Reversionary or survivor's pension payments accrued,
- 13 temporarily withheld, or represented by uncashed checks to
- 14 the date of death shall be paid to the reversionary
- 15 pensioner's or survivor's designated beneficiaries, or estate
- in the manner provided in this Section.
- On death of a retired teacher whose death occurs on or
- 18 after the effective date of this amendatory Act of 1991,
- there shall be payable a lump sum death benefit equal to 6
- 20 times the teacher's salary rate for his last month of service
- or \$10,000, whichever is less, upon death during the first
- year on pension minus 1/5 of the death benefit, as defined
- 23 herein, for each year or fraction thereof on pension after
- the first full year, to a minimum of \$5,000.
- Notwithstanding Section 17-157, the changes made in this

- 32 <u>Sec. 17-126.1. Repayment of survivor's refund. If any</u>
- 33 <u>person receives a survivor's refund pursuant to Section</u>

- 1 17-125 and chooses to reestablish a survivor's or children's
- 2 pension pursuant to Section 17-121, then he or she shall pay
- 3 <u>back to the Fund the survivor refund together with interest</u>
- 4 thereon at the rate of 5% per year, compounded annually from
- 5 the time the refund was paid to the date of repayment.
- 6 Section 90. The State Mandates Act is amended by adding
- 7 Section 8.26 as follows:
- 8 (30 ILCS 805/8.26 new)
- 9 <u>Sec. 8.26. Exempt mandate. Notwithstanding Sections 6</u>
- and 8 of this Act, no reimbursement by the State is required
- 11 for the implementation of any mandate created by this
