- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Elder Abuse and Neglect Act is amended by
- 5 changing Section 3 as follows:
- 6 (320 ILCS 20/3) (from Ch. 23, par. 6603)
- 7 Sec. 3. Responsibilities.
- 8 (a) The Department shall establish, design and manage a
- 9 program of response and services for persons 60 years of age
- 10 and older who have been, or are alleged to be, victims of
- 11 abuse, neglect, or financial exploitation. The Department
- 12 shall contract with or fund or, contract with and fund,
- 13 regional administrative agencies, provider agencies, or both,
- 14 for the provision of those functions, and, contingent on
- 15 adequate funding, with attorneys or legal services provider
- 16 agencies for the provision of legal assistance pursuant to
- 17 this Act.
- 18 (b) Each regional administrative agency shall designate
- 19 provider agencies within its planning and service area with
- 20 prior approval by the Department on Aging, monitor the use of
- 21 services, provide technical assistance to the provider
- 22 agencies and be involved in program development activities.
- 23 (c) Provider agencies shall assist, to the extent
- 24 possible, eligible adults who need agency services to allow

- 7 <u>financial exploitation known to the agency. As used in this</u>
- 8 <u>subsection</u>, "State agency" has the meaning attributed to that
- 9 <u>term in the Illinois State Auditing Act.</u>
