- Sec. 20. Judicial Security Officers. 7
- 8 (a) Subject to the qualifications listed below and the
- approval of the Supreme Court of Illinois, the Director of 9
- the Administrative Office of the Illinois Courts has the 10
- power to appoint persons as Judicial Security Officers. 11
- Judicial Security Officers shall have the primary 12
- 13 responsibility of providing for the personal security of the
- Justices of the Supreme Court of Illinois. Judicial Security 14
- Officers shall be peace officers, and as such, shall have all 15
