AN ACT concerning elections.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Election Code is amended by changing
Section 7-10 as follows:

6 (10 ILCS 5/7-10) (from Ch. 46, par. 7-10)

Sec. 7-10. Form of petition for nomination. The name of 7 8 no candidate for nomination, or State central committeeman, or township committeeman, or precinct committeeman, or ward 9 committeeman or candidate for delegate or alternate delegate 10 to national nominating conventions, shall be printed upon the 11 12 primary ballot unless a petition for nomination has been filed in his behalf as provided in this Article in 13 substantially the following form: 14

sheet of the petition other than the statement of 13 Each 14 candidacy and candidate's statement shall be of uniform size 15 and shall contain above the space for signatures an 16 appropriate heading giving the information as to name of candidate or candidates, in whose behalf such petition is 17 18 signed; the office, the political party represented and place 19 of residence; and the heading of each sheet shall be the 20 same.

21 Such petition shall be signed by qualified primary 22 electors residing in the political division for which the 23 nomination is sought in their own proper persons only and opposite the signature of each signer, his residence address 24 25 shall be written or printed. The residence address required to be written or printed opposite each qualified primary 26 elector's name shall include the street address or rural 27 28 route number of the signer, as the case may be, as well as the signer's county, and city, village or town, and state. 29 However the county or city, village or town, and state of 30 residence of the electors may be printed on the petition 31 32 forms where all of the electors signing the petition reside 33 in the same county or city, village or town, and state. 34 Standard abbreviations may be used in writing the residence

1 address, including street number, if any. At the bottom of 2 each sheet of such petition shall be added a statement signed by a registered voter of the political division, who has been 3 4 a registered voter at all times he or she circulated the 5 petition, for which the candidate is seeking a nomination, 6 stating the street address or rural route number of the 7 voter, as the case may be, as well as the voter's county, and 8 city, village or town, and state; and certifying that the 9 signatures on that sheet of the petition were signed in his presence; and either (1) indicating the dates on which that 10 11 sheet was circulated, or (2) indicating the first and last dates on which the sheet was circulated, or (3) certifying 12 that none of the signatures on the sheet were signed more 13 than 90 days preceding the last day for the filing of 14 the 15 petition, or more than 45 days preceding the last day for 16 filing of the petition in the case of political party and independent candidates for single or multi-county regional 17 18 superintendents of schools in the 1994 general primary 19 election; and certifying that the signatures on the sheet are genuine, and certifying that to the best of his knowledge 20 21 and belief the persons so signing were at the time of signing 22 the petitions qualified voters of the political party for 23 which a nomination is sought. Such statement shall be sworn to before some officer authorized to administer oaths in this 24 25 State.

No petition sheet shall be circulated more than 90 days preceding the last day provided in Section 7-12 for the filing of such petition, or more than 45 days preceding the last day for filing of the petition in the case of political party and independent candidates for single or multi-county regional superintendents of schools in the 1994 general primary election.

2 (1) the person striking the signature shall initial
3 the petition at the place where the signature is struck;
4 and

5 (2) the person striking the signature shall sign a 6 certification listing the page number and line number of 7 each signature struck from the petition. Such 8 certification shall be filed as a part of the petition.

9 Such sheets before being filed shall be neatly fastened together in book form, by placing the sheets in a pile and 10 11 fastening them together at one edge in a secure and suitable manner, and the sheets shall then be numbered consecutively. 12 The sheets shall not be fastened by pasting them together end 13 to end, so as to form a continuous strip or roll. 14 All 15 petition sheets which are filed with the proper local 16 election officials, election authorities or the State Board of Elections shall be the original sheets which have been 17 signed by the voters and by the circulator thereof, and not 18 photocopies or duplicates of such sheets. Each petition must 19 include as a part thereof, a statement of candidacy for each 20 21 of the candidates filing, or in whose behalf the petition is 22 filed. This statement shall set out the address of such 23 candidate, the office for which he is a candidate, shall state that the candidate is a qualified primary voter of the 24 25 party to which the petition relates and is qualified for the office specified (in the case of a candidate for State's 26 Attorney it shall state that the candidate is at the time of 27 filing such statement a licensed attorney-at-law of this 28 State), shall state that he has filed (or will file before 29 30 the close of the petition filing period) a statement of economic interests as required by the Illinois Governmental 31 32 Ethics Act, shall request that the candidate's name be placed upon the official ballot, and shall be subscribed and sworn 33 34 to by such candidate before some officer authorized to take

1 The petitions, when filed, shall not be withdrawn or 2 added to, and no signatures shall be revoked except by revocation filed in writing with the State Board 3 of 4 Elections, election authority or local election official with whom the petition is required to be filed, and before the 5 filing of such petition. Whoever forges the name of a signer 6 7 upon any petition required by this Article is deemed guilty 8 of a forgery and on conviction thereof shall be punished 9 accordingly.

Petitions of candidates for nomination for offices herein specified, to be filed with the same officer, may contain the names of 2 or more candidates of the same political party for the same or different offices.

Such petitions for nominations shall be signed:

15 (a) If for a State office, or for delegate or
16 alternate delegate to be elected from the State at large
17 to a National nominating convention by not less than
18 5,000 nor more than 10,000 primary electors of his party.

(b) If for a congressional officer or for delegate 19 or alternate delegate to be elected from a congressional 20 21 district to a national nominating convention by at least 22 .5% of the qualified primary electors of his party in his 23 congressional district, except that for the first primary following a redistricting of congressional districts such 24 25 petitions shall be signed by at least 600 qualified primary electors of the candidate's party in his 26 congressional district. 27

(c) If for a county office (including county board 28 29 member and chairman of the county board where elected 30 from the county at large), by at least .5% of the qualified electors of his party cast at the last 31 preceding general election in his county. However, if 32 for the nomination for county commissioner of Cook 33 County, then by at least .5% of the qualified primary 34

1 electors of his or her party in his or her county in the 2 district or division in which such person is a candidate for nomination; and if for county board member from a 3 4 county board district, then by at least .5% of the qualified primary electors of his party in the county 5 board district. In the case of an election for county 6 7 board member to be elected from a district, for the first 8 primary following a redistricting of county board 9 districts or the initial establishment of county board districts, then by at least .5% of the qualified electors 10 11 of his party in the entire county at the last preceding general election, divided by the number of county board 12 districts, but in any event not less than 25 qualified 13 primary electors of his party in the district. 14

15 (d) Ιf for a municipal or township office by at 16 least .5% of the qualified primary electors of his party in the municipality or township; if for alderman, by at 17 least .5% of the voters of his party of his ward. In the 18 case of an election for alderman or trustee of a 19 municipality to be elected from a ward or district, for 20 21 the first primary following a redistricting or the initial establishment of wards or districts, then by .5% 22 of the total number of votes cast for the candidate of 23 such political party who received the highest number of 24 votes in the entire municipality at the last regular 25 election at which an officer was regularly scheduled to 26 be elected from the entire municipality, divided by the 27 number of wards or districts, but in any event not less 28 than 25 qualified primary electors of his party in the 29 ward or district. 30

31 (e) If for State central committeeman, by at least
32 100 of the primary electors of his or her party of his or
33 her congressional district.

34

(f) If for a candidate for trustee of a sanitary

district in which trustees are not elected from wards, by
 at least .5% of the primary electors of his party, from
 such sanitary district.

4 (g) If for a candidate for trustee of a sanitary 5 district in which the trustees are elected from wards, by least .5% of the primary electors of his party in his 6 at 7 ward of such sanitary district, except that for the first 8 primary following a reapportionment of the district such 9 petitions shall be signed by at least 150 qualified primary electors of the candidate's ward of such sanitary 10 11 district.

12 (h) If The-number--of--signatures--required for а candidate for judicial office in a district, circuit, or 13 subcircuit, by a number of primary electors at least 14 equal to shall-be 0.25% of the number of votes cast for 15 16 the judicial candidate of his or her political party who received the highest number of votes at the last regular 17 general election at which a judicial officer from the 18 same district, circuit, or subcircuit was regularly 19 scheduled to be elected, but in no event fewer shall-be 20 21 less than 500 signatures.

22 (i) If for a candidate for precinct committeeman, least 10 primary electors of his or her party of 23 by at or her precinct; if for a candidate for ward 24 his committeeman, by not less than 10% (or 50, whichever is 25 greater) nor more than 16% (or 50 more than the minimum, 26 27 whichever is greater) of the primary electors of his party of his ward; if for a candidate for township 28 committeeman, by not less than 5% nor more than 8% (or 50 29 30 more than the minimum, whichever is greater) of the primary electors of his party in his township or part of 31 a township as the case may be. 32

(j) If for a candidate for State's Attorney or
 Regional Superintendent of Schools to serve 2 or more

1 2 counties, by at least .5% of the primary electors of his party in the territory comprising such counties.

3 (k) If for any other office by at least .5% of the 4 total number of registered voters of the political 5 subdivision, district or division for which the 6 nomination is made or a minimum of 25, whichever is 7 greater.

For the purposes of this Section the number of primary 8 9 electors shall be determined by taking the total vote cast, in the applicable district, for the candidate for such 10 11 political party who received the highest number of votes, state-wide, at the last general election in the State at 12 which electors for President of the United States were 13 elected. For political subdivisions, the number of primary 14 electors shall be determined by taking the total vote cast 15 16 for the candidate for such political party who received the highest number of votes in such political subdivision at the 17 last regular election at which an officer was regularly 18 19 scheduled to be elected from that subdivision. For wards or districts of political subdivisions, the number of primary 20 21 electors shall be determined by taking the total vote cast 22 for the candidate for such political party who received the 23 highest number of votes in such ward or district at the last regular election at which an officer was regularly scheduled 24 25 to be elected from that ward or district.

A "qualified primary elector" of a party may not sign petitions for or be a candidate in the primary of more than one party.
