Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

History of United States. History of the 7 Sec. 27-21. 8 United States shall be taught in all public schools and in all other educational institutions in this State supported or 9 maintained, in whole or in part, by public funds. The 10 teaching of history shall have as one of its objectives 11 the imparting to pupils of a comprehensive idea of our democratic 12 13 form of government and the principles for which our government stands as regards other nations, including the 14 15 studying of the place of our government in world-wide 16 movements and the leaders thereof, with particular stress upon the basic principles and ideals of our representative 17 18 form of government. The teaching of history shall include a study of the role and contributions of African Americans 19 20 American--Negrees and other ethnic groups including but not restricted to Polish, Lithuanian, German, Hungarian, 21 Irish, 22 Bohemian, Russian, Albanian, Italian, Czechoslavakian, French, Scots, <u>Hispanics</u>, etc., in the history of this 23 country and this State. The teaching of history also shall 24 include a study of the role of labor unions and their 25 26 interaction with government in achieving the goals of a mixed 27 free enterprise system. No pupils shall be graduated from the eighth grade of any public school unless he has received 28 29 such instruction in the history of the United States and gives evidence of having a comprehensive knowledge thereof. 30 (Source: P.A. 84-126.) 31
