 - (b) accepts contributions or makes expenditures during any 12-month period in an aggregate amount exceeding \$4,000 \$3,000 in support of or in opposition to any question of public policy to be submitted to the electors of an area encompassing no more than one county; or
 - (c) accepts contributions or makes expenditures during any 12-month period in an aggregate amount exceeding \$4,000 \$3,000 and has as its primary purpose the furtherance of governmental, political or social values, is organized on a not-for-profit basis, and which publicly endorses or publicly opposes a candidate or

- 8 Sec. 9-1.8. "State political committee" means the 9 candidate himself or any individual, trust, partnership, 10 committee, association, corporation, or any other 11 organization or group of persons which--
 - (a) accepts contributions or grants or makes expenditures during any 12-month period in an aggregate amount exceeding \$4,000 \$3,000 on behalf of or in opposition to a candidate or candidates for public office who are required by the Illinois Governmental Ethics Act to file statements of economic interests with the Secretary of State,
 - (b) accepts contributions or makes expenditures during any 12-month period in an aggregate amount exceeding \$4,000 \$3,000 in support of or in opposition to any question of public policy to be submitted to the electors of an area encompassing more than one county, or
- (c) accepts contributions or makes expenditures during 23 24 any 12-month period in an aggregate amount exceeding \$4,000 \$3,000 and has as its primary purpose the furtherance of 25 governmental, political or social values, is organized on a 26 not-for-profit basis, and which publicly endorses or publicly 27 28 opposes a candidate or candidates for public office who are 29 required by the Illinois Governmental Ethics Act to file statements of economic interest with the Secretary of State. 30

"Political committee" includes State central 2 and county central committees of any political party, and also includes local political committees and state political 3 4 committees, but does not include any candidate who does not 5 accept contributions or make expenditures during any 12-month period in an aggregate amount exceeding \$4,000 \$3,000, nor 6 7 does it include, with the exception of State central and county central committees of any political party, any 8 9 individual, trust, partnership, committee, association, corporation, or any other organization or group of persons 10 11 which does not accept contributions or make expenditures during any 12-month period in an aggregate amount exceeding 12 \$4,000 \$3,00 on behalf of or in opposition to a candidate or 13 candidates or to any question of public policy, and such 14 candidates and persons shall not be required to comply with 15 16 any filing provisions in this Article.
