- 8 (a) A person commits cyberstalking when he or she,
- 9 knowingly and without lawful justification, on at least 2

- 12 <u>(1) at any time transmits a threat of immediate or</u>
- 13 <u>future bodily harm, sexual assault, confinement, or</u>

- 16 (2) places that person or a family member of that
- 17 <u>person in reasonable apprehension of immediate or future</u>
- bodily harm, sexual assault, confinement, or restraint.
- (b) As used in this Section:
- 20 "Harass" means to engage in a knowing and willful course
- 21 of conduct directed at a specific person that alarms,
- 22 <u>torments</u>, or terrorizes that person.
- 23 <u>"Electronic communication" means any transfer of signs,</u>
