- 4 Section 5. The Acupuncture Practice Act is amended by
- adding Section 20.1 and changing Section 50 as follows: 5
- 6 (225 ILCS 2/20.1 new) Sec. 20.1. Guest instructors of acupuncture. The 7 8 provisions of this Act do not prohibit an acupuncturist from another State or country, who is not licensed under this Act 9 and who is an invited quest of a professional acupuncture 10 association or scientific acupuncture foundation or an 11 12 acupuncture training program or continuing education provider that is approved under this Act, from engaging in 13 professional education through lectures, clinics, or 14 demonstrations. To qualify as a guest instructor of 15 acupuncture, the acupuncturist must have been issued a guest 16 instructor of acupuncture permit by the Department. The 17 Department shall grant a guest instructor of acupuncture 18 19 permit if the Department determines that the applicant for 20 the permit (i) is currently certified in good standing as an acupuncturist by the National Certification Commission for 21 Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine; or (ii) has sufficient 22 training to qualify as a licensed acupuncturist in Illinois. 23 By rule, the Department may prescribe forms that shall be 24 used to apply for guest instructor of acupuncture permits and 25 charge an application fee to defray expenses borne by the Department in connection with implementation of this 27

- shall submit his or her application for a guest instructor of 29
- acupuncture permit to the Department. The Department shall 30

The <u>Department</u> shall maintain a registry of 4 guest instructors of acupuncture. A guest instructor of acupuncture permit shall be valid for 12 months. The guest 5 instructor of acupuncture may engage in the application of 6 acupuncture techniques in conjunction with the lectures, 7 8 clinics, or demonstrations for a maximum of 12 months, but may not open an office, appoint a place to meet private 9 10 patients, consult with private patients, or otherwise engage
