- 1 AN ACT concerning schools.
- WHEREAS, an estimated 5.3 million American children have
- 3 asthma; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Asthma is the leading serious chronic illness
- 5 among children and annually incurs a cost of \$3.2 billion in
- 6 treating this young population; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Asthma accounts for 10 million lost school days
- 8 each year in the United States and is the leading cause of
- 9 school absenteeism attributed to chronic conditions; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Asthma is the third-ranking cause of
- 11 hospitalization among children under the age of 15 years and
- 12 accounts for almost one in 6 of all pediatric emergency room
- 13 visits; and
- 14 WHEREAS, There are more than 5,400 deaths from asthma in
- this country each year; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Known asthma triggers range from viral
- 17 infections to allergies to irritating gases and particles in
- 18 the air; and
- 19 WHEREAS, An estimated 200,000 U.S. children with asthma
- 20 have their condition worsened by exposure to second-hand
- 21 smoke; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Resulting asthma attacks in children can be
- 23 severe; the child may become breathless and have difficulty
- talking; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Children with asthma are taught by their

- 1 physician or other State-licensed health care provider to
- 2 take medication to prevent an attack or to help them if an
- 3 attack occurs; and
- 4 WHEREAS, A child's asthma can be managed by both
- 5 treatment and medication; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Elementary and secondary school students with
- 7 asthma should have unobstructed access to their asthma
- 8 medication; therefore
- 9 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 10 represented in the General Assembly:
- 11 Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Section
- 12 22-30 as follows:
- 13 (105 ILCS 5/22-30 new)
- 14 <u>Sec. 22-30. Self-administration of asthma medication.</u>
- 15 <u>(a) In this Section:</u>
- 16 <u>"Medication" means a medicine, prescribed by (i) a</u>
- 17 physician licensed to practice medicine in all its branches,
- 18 (ii) a physician assistant who has been delegated the
- 19 <u>authority to prescribe asthma medications by his or her</u>
- 20 supervising physician, or (iii) an advanced practice
- 21 <u>registered nurse who has a written collaborative agreement</u>
- 22 <u>with a collaborating physician that delegates the authority</u>
- 23 <u>to prescribe asthma medications, for a pupil that pertains to</u>
- 24 the pupil's asthma and that has an individual prescription
- 25 <u>label.</u>
- 26 <u>"Self-administration" means a pupil's discretionary use</u>
- of his or her prescribed asthma medication.
- 28 (b) A school, whether public or nonpublic, must permit
- 29 <u>the self-administration of medication by a pupil with asthma,</u>

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<pre>provided that:</pre>

- 2 (1) the parents or guardians of the pupil provide 3 to the school written authorization for the
- 4 <u>self-administration of medication; and</u>
- (2) the parents or guardians of the pupil provide

 to the school a written statement from the pupil's

 physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice
- 8 <u>registered nurse containing the following information:</u>
- 9 <u>(A) the name and purpose of the medication;</u>
- 10 (B) the prescribed dosage; and
- (C) the time or times at which or the special
- 12 <u>circumstances under which the medication is to be</u>
- 13 <u>administered.</u>
- 14 The information provided shall be kept on file in the office
- of the school nurse or, in the absence of a school nurse, the
- school's administrator.
- 17 (c) The school district or nonpublic school must inform
- 18 the parents or guardians of the pupil, in writing, that the
- 19 school district or nonpublic school and its employees and
- 20 agents are to incur no liability as a result of any injury
- 21 <u>arising from the self-administration of medication by the</u>
- 22 pupil. The parents or guardians of the pupil must sign a

statement acknowledging that the school district or nonpublic

- 24 school is to incur no liability as a result of any injury
- 25 <u>arising from the self-administration of medication by the</u>
- 26 pupil and that the parents or guardians must indemnify and
- 27 <u>hold harmless the school district or nonpublic school and its</u>
- 28 <u>employees and agents against any claims arising out of the</u>
- 29 <u>self-administration of medication by the pupil.</u>
- 30 (d) The permission for self-administration of medication
- 31 <u>is effective for the school year for which it is granted and</u>
- 32 <u>shall be renewed each subsequent school year upon fulfillment</u>
- of the requirements of this Section.
- 34 (e) Provided that the requirements of this Section are

- 1 <u>fulfilled</u>, a pupil with asthma may possess and use his or her
- 2 medication (i) while in school, (ii) while at a
- 3 school-sponsored activity, (iii) while under the supervision
- 4 <u>of school personnel, or (iv) before or after normal school</u>
- 5 <u>activities</u>, <u>such</u> as <u>while</u> in <u>before-school</u> or <u>after-school</u>
- 6 <u>care on school-operated property.</u>
- 7 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 8 becoming law.
