- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Renter's Financial Responsibility and
- 5 Protection Act is amended by changing Section 15 as follows:
- 6 (625 ILCS 27/15)
- 7 Sec. 15. Prohibited practices.
- 8 (a) A rental company may not sell a damage waiver unless
- 9 the renter agrees to the damage waiver in writing at or prior
- 10 to the time the rental agreement is executed.
- 11 (b) A rental company may not void a damage waiver except
- 12 for one or more of the following reasons:
- 13 (1) Damage or loss while the rental vehicle is used
