AN ACT concerning the circulation of election petitions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Election Code is amended by changing 5 Sections 3-1.2, 7-10, 8-8, 10-4, and 28-3 as follows:

Sec. 3-1.2. Eligibility to sign or--eireulate petition. 7 8 For the purpose of determining eligibility to sign Θ r eireulate a nominating petition or a petition proposing a 9 public question the terms "voter", "registered 10 voter", "qualified voter", "legal voter", "elector", "qualified 11 elector", "primary elector" and "qualified primary elector" 12 13 as used in this Code or in another Statute shall mean a person who is registered to vote at the address shown 14 15 opposite his signature on the petition or was registered to vote at such address when he signed the petition. Any person, 16 otherwise qualified under this Section, who has not moved to 17 another residence but whose address has changed as a result 18 19 of implementation of a 9-1-1 emergency telephone system shall 20 be considered a "voter", "registered voter", "qualified voter", "legal voter", "elector", "qualified 21 elector", 22 "primary elector", and "qualified primary elector".

The name of no candidate for nomination, or State central committeeman, or township committeeman, or precinct committeeman, or ward committeeman or candidate for delegate or alternate delegate to national nominating conventions, shall be printed upon the primary ballot unless a petition for nomination has been filed in his behalf as provided in this Article in

At the bottom of 22 each sheet of such petition shall be added a circulator 23 statement signed by a person 18 years of age or older who is 24 a citizen of the United States registered--voter--of--the 25 political--division,--who--has-been-a-registered-voter-at-all times-he-or--she--circulated--the--petition,--for--which--the 26 27 eandidate-is-seeking-a-nomination, stating the street address or rural route number of-the-voter, as the case may be, as 28 29 well as the voter's county, and city, village or town, and 30 state; and certifying that the signatures on that sheet of 31 the petition were signed in his <u>or her</u> presence <u>and</u> certifying that the signatures are genuine; and either (1) 32 indicating the dates on which that sheet was circulated, or 33 34 (2) indicating the first and last dates on which the sheet

No petition sheet shall be circulated more than 90 days preceding the last day provided in Section 7-12 for the filing of such petition,-or-more-than-45-days--preceding--the last--day-for-filing-of-the-petition-in-the-case-of-political party-and-independent-candidates-for-single--or--multi-county regional--superintendents--of--schools--in--the--1994-general primary-election.

The person circulating the petition, or the candidate on whose behalf the petition is circulated, may strike any signature from the petition, provided that:;

(1) the person striking the signature shall initial
the petition at the place where the signature is struck;
and

(2) the person striking the signature shall sign a
certification listing the page number and line number of
each signature struck from the petition. Such
certification shall be filed as a part of the petition.

31 Such sheets before being filed shall be neatly fastened 32 together in book form, by placing the sheets in a pile and 33 fastening them together at one edge in a secure and suitable 34 manner, and the sheets shall then be numbered consecutively.

1 The sheets shall not be fastened by pasting them together end 2 to end, so as to form a continuous strip or roll. All petition sheets which are filed with the proper local 3 election officials, election authorities or the State Board 4 5 of Elections shall be the original sheets which have been 6 signed by the voters and by the circulator thereof, and not 7 photocopies or duplicates of such sheets. Each petition must include as a part thereof, a statement of candidacy for each 8 of the candidates filing, or in whose behalf the petition is 9 filed. The petitions, when filed, shall not be withdrawn or 22 23 added to, and no signatures shall be revoked except by revocation filed in writing with the State Board of 24 25 Elections, election authority or local election official with whom the petition is required to be filed, and before the 26 filing of such petition. Whoever forges the name of a signer 27 28 upon any petition required by this Article is deemed guilty of a forgery and on conviction thereof shall be punished 29 30 accordingly.

Petitions of candidates for nomination for offices herein specified, to be filed with the same officer, may contain the names of 2 or more candidates of the same political party for the same or different offices.

No signature shall be valid or be counted in considering the validity or sufficiency of 28 29 such petition unless the requirements of this Section are 30 complied with.

At the bottom of each sheet of such petition shall be added a <u>circulator's</u> statement, signed by a <u>person 18 years</u> <u>of age or older who is a citizen of the United States</u> registered-voter,-who-has-been--a--registered--voter--at--all

1 times--he--or--she--eirculated-the-petition,-of-the-political 2 subdivision--or--district--or--precinct--or--combination---of precincts--in--which--the--question-of-public-policy-is-to-be 3 4 submitted, stating the street address or rural route number of--the--voter, as the case may be, as well as the voter's 5 county, and city, village or town, and state; certifying that 6 7 the signatures on that sheet of the petition were signed in 8 his or her presence and are genuine, and that to the best of his or her knowledge and belief the persons so signing were 9 at the time of signing the petition registered voters of the 10 11 political subdivision or district or precinct or combination 12 of precincts in which the question of public policy is to be submitted and that their respective residences are correctly 13 stated therein. Such statement shall be sworn to before some 14 15 officer authorized to administer oaths in this State.

16 Such sheets, before being filed with the proper officer or board shall be bound securely and numbered consecutively. 17 The sheets shall not be fastened by pasting them together end 18 to end, so as to form a continuous strip or roll. All 19 20 petition sheets which are filed with the proper local 21 election officials, election authorities or the State Board 22 of Elections shall be the original sheets which have been 23 by the voters and by the circulator, and not signed photocopies or duplicates of such sheets. A petition, 24 when 25 presented or filed, shall not be withdrawn, altered, or added to, and no signature shall be revoked except by revocation in 26 writing presented or filed with the board or officer with 27 whom the petition is required to be presented or filed, 28 and 29 before the presentment or filing of such petition, except as 30 may otherwise be provided in another statute which authorize the public question. Whoever forges any name of a signer upon 31 any petition shall be deemed guilty of a forgery, and on 32 33 conviction thereof, shall be punished accordingly.

34 In addition to the foregoing requirements, a petition

1 proposing an amendment to Article IV of the Constitution 2 pursuant to Section 3 of Article XIV of the Constitution or a 3 petition proposing a question of public policy to be 4 submitted to the voters of the entire State shall be in 5 conformity with the requirements of Section 28-9 of this 6 Article.

If multiple sets of petitions for submission of the same 7 public questions are filed, the State Board of Elections, 8 9 appropriate election authority or local election official where the petitions are filed shall within 2 business days 10 11 notify the proponent of his or her multiple petition filings and that proponent has 3 business days after receipt of the 12 notice to notify the State Board of Elections, appropriate 13 election authority or local election official that he or she 14 may cancel prior sets of petitions. 15 If the proponent 16 notifies the State Board of Elections, appropriate election authority or local election official, the last set of 17 petitions filed shall be the only petitions to be considered 18 19 valid by the State Board of Elections, appropriate election authority or local election official. If the proponent fails 20 to notify the State Board of Elections, appropriate election 21 authority or local election official then only the first set 22 petitions filed shall be valid and all subsequent 23 of petitions shall be void. 24
