AN ACT making appropriations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

ARTICLE 1

5 CONSERVATION 2000 PROGRAM 6 Section 1. The amount of \$5,250,000 is appropriated from 7 the Capital Development Fund to the Department of Natural 8 Resources for deposit into the Conservation 2000 Projects 9 Fund.

Section 2. The sum of \$6,400,000, new appropriation, 10 is appropriated, and the sum of \$8,965,700, or so much thereof 11 12 as may be necessary and as remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2001, from appropriations heretofore 13 14 made in Article 11, Section 2 of Public Act 91-706, as 15 amended, is reappropriated from the Conservation 2000 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the Conservation 2000 16 17 Program to implement ecosystem-based management for Illinois' 18 natural resources.

19 Section 3.
