- 1 AN ACT in relation to education.
- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Section
- 5 14-9.05 as follows:
- 6 (105 ILCS 5/14-9.05 new)
- 7 Sec. 14-9.05. Temporary special education teacher
- 8 certification.
- 9 <u>(a) The General Assembly makes all of the following</u>
- 10 <u>findings:</u>
- 11 (1) There exists throughout this State a severe
- shortage of special education teachers, and this shortage
- 13 <u>has existed for many years and gives no indication of</u>
- abating at anytime in the future.
- 15 (2) As a result of this shortage of special
- 16 <u>education teachers, school districts and private special</u>
- 17 <u>education facilities throughout this State are finding it</u>
- 18 <u>increasingly difficult to hire and maintain a sufficient</u>
- 19 <u>number of special education teachers to meet the needs of</u>
- 20 <u>their children with disabilities.</u>
- 21 (3) If a solution is not found to alleviate the
- 22 <u>effects of this shortage of special education teachers,</u>
- 23 <u>the high quality of special education that the school</u>
- 24 <u>districts and private special education facilities of</u>
- 25 <u>this State provide could be in jeopardy.</u>
- 26 <u>(4) As a result of this shortage of special</u>
- 27 <u>education teachers and the potential impact that this</u>
- 28 <u>shortage may have on this State's special education</u>
- 29 <u>system, the General Assembly believes that a temporary</u>

- 31 <u>necessary.</u>

1	(b) The State Teacher Certification Board shall issue
2	temporary special education teacher certificates for teaching
3	children with disabilities, other than students who are deaf
4	or hard of hearing, blind or visually impaired, or speech or
5	language impaired, to persons who satisfy the requirements of
6	this Section. Certificates shall be issued only during the
7	3-year period beginning on July 1, 2002. The powers granted
8	to the State Teacher Certification Board concerning the
9	issuance of temporary special education teacher certificates
10	under this Section expire on July 1, 2005. Notwithstanding
11	that expiration, any certificate issued before July 1, 2005
12	is valid until the date of the certificate's expiration. Once
13	issued, a temporary special education teacher certificate is
14	valid for a period of 3 years.
15	(c) A person seeking certification under this Section

 16 <u>must meet all of the following requirements:</u>
- (1) The person possesses either a valid teaching

 certificate issued by any state or a possession or

 territory of the United States or a certificate issued

 pursuant to Section 21-9 of this Code.
- 21 (2) The person has the qualifications to be 22 certified to teach under Section 21-1 of this Code.

(d) A person seeking temporary special education teacher certification must be enrolled in an approved special education teacher preparation program at a recognized institution of higher learning, as defined under Article 21 of this Code, and meet, within 3 years after issuance of the temporary special education teacher certificate, the requirements to receive a special certificate pursuant to Section 21-4 of this Code, except that a person seeking temporary special education teacher certification who has been teaching under a certificate valid for teaching in the common schools of this State for a minimum of 3 years and who has received a satisfactory evaluation and an appropriate

<u>learning</u> is exempt from the student teaching requirement. The

3 <u>holder of a temporary special education teacher certificate</u>

4 <u>must pass the basic skills test required for certification to</u>

teach in the common schools of this State within one year

after issuance of the temporary special education teacher

7 <u>certificate.</u>

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(e) A person is not eliqible for employment by a school district, for employment in a program under a special education joint agreement, or for employment in a private special education facility as a temporarily certified special education teacher unless he or she holds a valid substitute teacher's certificate pursuant to Section 21-9 of this Code. The person must not be employed to replace any currently employed teacher who otherwise would not be replaced for any reason. Before being assigned to a classroom with children with disabilities for the first time, the person must successfully complete a pre-service training program on educating children with disabilities that has been approved by the State Board of Education and that is provided by the employing entity or a recognized institution of higher learning, as defined under Article 21 of this Code. An employing entity must assign a mentoring teacher to the person for the duration of his or her employment with the entity as a temporarily certified special education teacher.

(f) A person employed by a school district or employed in a program under a special education joint agreement as a temporarily certified special education teacher shall have that employment credited to him or her for the purpose of determining, under the provisions of this Code, eligibility to enter upon contractual continued service, provided that the employment immediately precedes and is consecutive with the year in which the person becomes certified under Article 21 of this Code. For the purposes of determining the minimum

salary payable to the person and the employment benefits that

- 2 the person is entitled to, the person is deemed to have been
- 3 trained at a recognized institution of higher learning, as
- 4 <u>defined under Article 21 of this Code</u>, and the person is
- 5 <u>eligible for salary and benefits as a beginning full-time</u>
- 6 <u>teacher of the employing entity.</u>
- 7 (g) The provisions of Article 21 of this Code that apply
- 8 to certificates issued under Article 21 apply to temporary
- 9 special education teacher certificates to the extent that
- 10 those provisions are not contradicted by or inconsistent with

- 12 (h) In order to assist the State Board of Education and
- 13 <u>the State Teacher Certification Board in evaluating the</u>
- 14 special education certification process in this State, any
- 15 <u>school district, program under a special education joint</u>

- 17 <u>temporarily certified special education teacher must annually</u>
- 18 report all of the following to the State Board of Education:

- 26 <u>(4) The number of special education teacher</u>

- 28 <u>(5) The other methods that are being undertaken to</u>
- 29 <u>fill special education teacher vacancies.</u>
- 30 (i) The State Board of Education, in consultation with
- 31 the State Teacher Certification Board, may adopt any rules
- necessary to implement and administer this Section.
