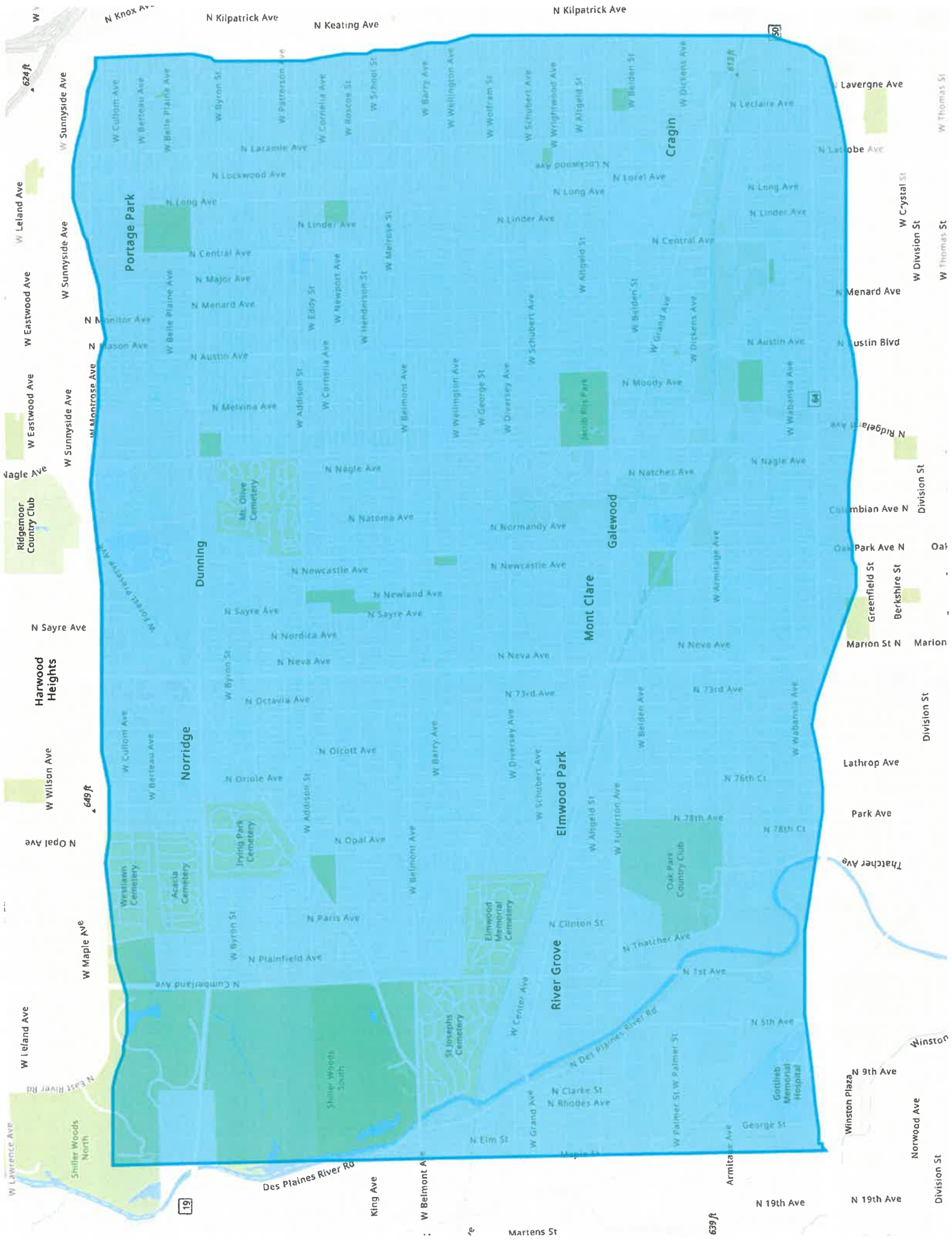


Marco G. - Self

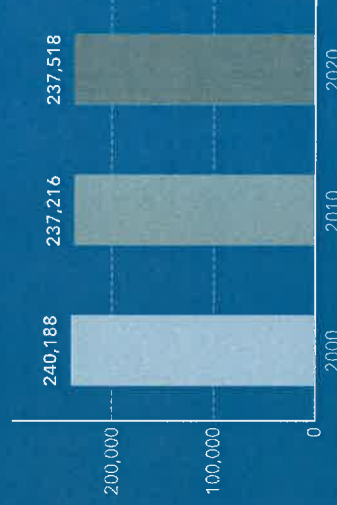

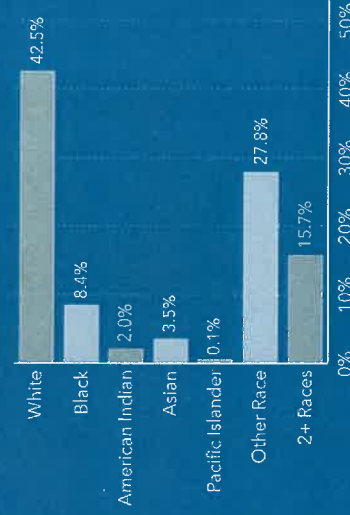

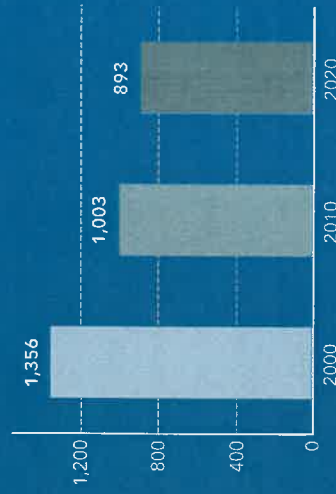
HOUSEHOLD POPULATION



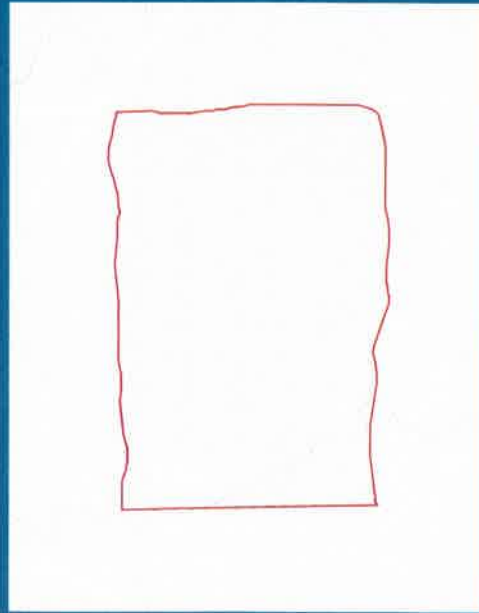
TOTAL POPULATION BY RACE

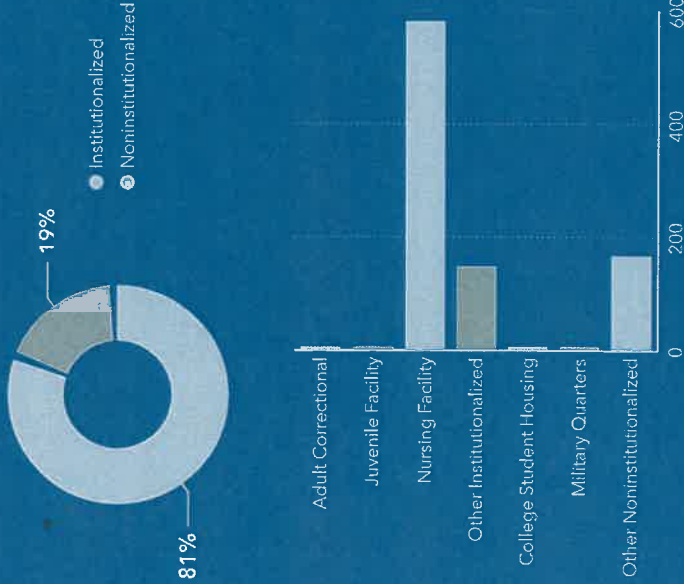
